Round Top. 34, \$7; 6th, Hermann Boettcher, Oldenburg, 34, \$5; 6th, Chas. Levien, Round Top, 34, \$4; 7th Otto Helmecke, Round Top, 34 \$3; 8th, Aug. Huehnefeld, Warrenton, 34, \$2; 9th, Joe Hafernick Warrenton, 34, \$1.50; 10th, Geo. Bell, Haw Creek, S4, \$1; 11th, Ed. Wiedersenders, Round Top, 33, \$0.50. After dinner there was public speaking. The following gentlemen spoke: Mr. Percy Fairon, candidate for county attorney, spoke in English; Mr. Juseph Ehlinger, candidate for county judge spoke in German, also F. A. Schlick, candidate for Representative, spoke in German and mostly about the amendments. Mr. Kaennemacher, of Austin, spoke in the interest of the Hermann Soehne. After that the ball began in the Round Top Schuetzen hall. The feast was not as well attended as usual, then about dinner it started to rain and rained a very good
